## ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

### Eric Thériault, tenor



While being an apprentice with the **Santa Fe Opera** in 2007, Mr. Thériault received the **Campbell Wachter Memorial Award** from the company. Apart from obtaining a Master of Music degree from the *San Francisco Conservatory of music*, with the precious support of the **Baxter & Alma Ricard scholarship**, he also trained at the *Canadian Vocal Art Institute*, and at *Nice International Summer Academy*. Amongst his realizations, he sang the role of Gnyphos in the world premiere of *Young Caesar*, an opera by Lou Harrison, was soloist for the north American premiere of Telemann's oratorio *Jauchzet Jubilier und Singe*, and received a Quebec Opus Award for his participation in the *BachToTango* concert with *Quartango* ensemble.

Over the years, he appeared frequently with **Opéra de Québec** as; **Alfred** (*Die Fledermaus*), **Bobinet** (*La Vie Parisienne*), **Malcolm** (*Macbeth*), and **Gherardo** (*Gianni Schicchi*). His great acting and comedic skills, paired with a vibrant voice from top to bottom, also allowed him to portray brilliantly certain operetta roles. Amongst others, *Ouf 1er* (*L'Etoile*), and *Falsa-Cappa* (*Les Brigands*) became signature roles for him. Since the start of his career, Mr. Thériault sang with many Canadian and international ensembles, such as: **Santa Fe Opera**, **Orchestre de la Garde Républicaine de Paris**, **Ensemble Parallèle**, **Domaine Forget**, **Canada Musical Youth**, **Lamèque International Baroque Festival**, **Orford Festival**, **Orchestre Symphonique du Saguenay-Lac-St-Jean**, **Orchestre symphonique de Trois-Rivières**, **Opera New Brunswick**, **Musica Orbium**, **Choeur Classique de Montréal**, **Symphony New-Brunswick**, and **Orchestre Métropolitain**. Most recently, he took part in the **Lanaudière Festival's** rendition of *Parsifal*, conducted by Maestro Nezet-Seguin.
